## MONROE RESIDENTS WILL RECEIVE PARK STICKERS IN THE MAIL

**MONROE** – Starting this year, Monroe residents will be getting their annual park sticker in the mail. In the past, residents had to drive to the park during specific hours and bring their motor vehicle registration for each vehicle. Instead, the stickers will simply be inserted into the motor vehicle tax bills.

“This was a simple solution to remove a source of frustration for residents,” said First Selectman Ken Kellogg. “Through a collaboration with our Parks & Recreation Department and the Tax Collector’s Office, we have crafted a budget-neutral way to distribute park stickers in a way that is much more convenient to residents.”

The new stickers will be valid from July 1, 2019 – June 30, 2020. The old, 2018 stickers will be honored until June 30<sup>th</sup> of this year. “Any Monroe resident who doesn’t have the old 2018 sticker for their car can call the Parks & Recreation Department at 203-452-2806 and we will make arrangements to provide one,” said Missy Orosz, Director of Parks & Recreation.

Kellogg stated that the stickers will be included for up to four vehicles per motor vehicle tax bill. Each sticker will be issued for a specific vehicle, indicated by the license plate printed on the sticker. Residents should be careful to apply each sticker to the vehicle with the matching license plate. Stickers will be issued for vehicles registered as passenger, combination, motorcycle, antique, and handicap.

For those that lease their vehicle (and therefore do not get the tax bill) the Town is coordinating a separate mailing to those residents. “Through our database, we can determine those residents leasing their vehicle and ensure they receive a sticker as well,” said Tax Collector Deb Heim.

In the event residents need additional stickers – such as after purchasing a new vehicle or replacing a windshield – there will be a few options. In those situations, stickers will remain available at no cost at the Wolfe Park Pool during their normal hours, as well as at Town Hall at the Parks & Recreation Department and Tax Collector’s Offices.
